Pastor's Corner...

We're getting into the season of Lent, that 40 day journey that calls us to focus on the Passion of our Lord. Some people give up something to help them remember what Christ gave up for them. Others choose a special project to do to help other remember Christ's suffering and death. I have found that music can aid people during their 40 day Lenten journey. Our Lutheran hymnody is filled with wonderful tunes and poignant verses that greatly enhance these 40 days. Let me share some of these verses with you

Jesus, I will ponder now On Your holy passion; With Your Spirit me endow For such meditation. Grant that I in love and faith May the image cherish Of Your suff'ring, pain, and death That I may not perish.

Grant that I Your passion view With repentant grieving.
Let me not bring shame to You By unholy living.
How could I refuse to shun Ev'ry sinful pleasure
Since for me God's only Son Suffered without measure?
[LSB 440 "Jesus, I Will Ponder Now" vv 1, 4]

For me, this is my prayer to begin Lent. O Lord, let me in these 40 days, truly ponder again your Passion for me. Let me truly look at it with repentant grieving, for it was my sins that nailed you to the cross. Let that be your prayer these 40 days.

Not all the blood of beasts On Jewish altars slain Could give the guilty conscience peace Or wash away the stain.

But Christ, the heav'nly Lamb, Takes all our sins away; A sacrifice of nobler name And richer blood than they. [LSB 431 "Not All The Blood Of Beasts" vv 1-2]

Remember the worship life of the Israelites? It was one of daily ritual, daily sacrifice, daily shedding of blood. Not even the most faithful Israelite, or their faithful obedience to the covenant would ever truly, completely cleanse them or their conscience. Yes, blood had to be shed to make atonement for sin. Ultimately, there was no animal that could make satisfactory atonement. It was only the innocent blood of the Messiah, the heavenly Lamb of God, that could take away all the sin of the world. His blood is far more precious & powerful than the blood of beasts.

When I survey the wondrous cross On which the Prince of Glory died, My richest gain I count but loss And pour contempt on all my pride.

Pastor's Corner Continued:

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast Save in the death of Christ, my God; All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood.

[LSB 425 "When I Survey The Wondrous Cross" vv 1-2]

I read these words and I hear these words of Scripture, "But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." [Galatians 6:14] After all it is the cross of Christ on which we focus our attention, and all the more during the days of Lent.



What is the Significance of Lent?

Early in the Church's history, the major events in Christ's life were observed with special observances, such as His birth, baptism, death, resurrection and ascension. As these observances developed, a period of time was set aside prior to the major events of Jesus' birth and resurrection as a time of preparation. During Lent, the Church's worship assumes a more penitential character. The color for the season is purple, a color often associated with penitence. The "Hymn of Praise" is omitted from the liturgy. The word "Alleluia" is usually omitted as well. By not using the alleluia-a joyful expression meaning "Praise the Lord"-until Easter, the Lenten season is clearly set apart as a distinct time from the rest of the year. Additionally, it forms a powerful contrast with the festive celebration of Jesus' resurrection when our alleluias ring loud and clear. Finally, the penitential character of Lent is not its sole purpose. In the ancient Church, the weeks leading up to Easter were a time of intensive preparation of the candidates who were to be baptized at the Easter vigil on Holy Saturday. This time in the Church's calendar was seen as an especially appropriate time for Baptism because of the relationship between Christ's death and resurrection and our own in Holy Baptism (see Romans 6:1-11). This focus would suggest that the season of Lent serves not only as a time to meditate on the suffering that Christ endured on our behalf but also as an opportunity to reflect upon our own Baptism and what it means to live as a child of God.

Q: Do Lutherans have to give up something for Lent as some other denominations require?

From the perspective of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, "giving something up for Lent" is entirely a matter of Christian freedom. It would be wrong, from our perspective, for the church to make some sort of "law" requiring its members to "give something up for Lent," since the Scriptures themselves do not require this. If, on the other hand, a Christian wants to give something up for Lent as a way of remembering and personalizing the great sacrifice that Christ made on the cross for our sins, then that Christian is certainly free to do so—as long as he or she does not "judge" or "look down on" other Christians who do not choose to do this. 


