From Our Pastor....

Two teenage boys asked their father if they could watch a movie at the theater. Dad read some reviews of the movie they wanted to see and said they could not go. "Aw Dad, why not?" they complained. "It's rated PG-13, and we're both older than thirteen!" Dad replied, "Because that movie contains some immoral and unacceptable behavior." "But dad, those are very small parts of the movie. It's a story of good beating evil and there are other good things in it like courage and self-sacrifice." "My answer is 'no,' and that is my final answer. End of discussion."

The boys dejectedly walked away and slumped on the couch. As they commiserated, they heard their father making something in the kitchen. Soon they smelled the wonderful aroma of fresh baked brownies. They thought, "Dad must be feeling bad, that's why he's making us brownies. Maybe we can soften him up with lots of praise and then he'll let us go to the movie."

The teens were not disappointed. Soon their father appeared with a plate of warm brownies which he offered to his kids. They each took one. Then, their father said, "Before you eat, I want to tell you something: I love you both so much."

The boys smiled at each other with knowing glances. Dad was softening. "That is why I've made these brownies with the very best ingredients. I've made them from scratch. Most of the ingredients are even organic. The best organic flour. The best free-range eggs. The best organic sugar. Premium vanilla and chocolate." The brownies looked mouth watering, and the teens began to become a little impatient with their dad's long speech. "But I want to be perfectly honest with you. There is one ingredient I added that is not usually found in brownies. I got that ingredient from our own back yard. But you needn't worry, because I only added the tiniest bit of that ingredient to your brownies. The amount of the portion is practically insignificant. So go ahead, take a bite and let me know what you think."

"Dad, would you mind telling us what that mystery ingredient is before we eat?"

"Why? The portion I added was so small. Just a teaspoonful. You won't even taste it."

"Come on, Dad! Just tell us what that ingredient is."

"Don't worry! It's organic, just like the other ingredients."

"Dad!"

"Well, OK, if you insist. That secret ingredient is organic...dog poop."

Both teens instantly dropped their brownies back on the plate and began inspecting their fingers with horror. "DAD! Why did you do that? You've tortured us by making us smell those brownies cooking for the last half hour, and now you tell us that you added dog poop! We can't eat these brownies!"

"Why not? The amount of dog poop is very small compared to the rest of the ingredients. It won't hurt you. It's been cooked right along with the other ingredients. You won't even taste it. It has the same consistency as the brownies. Go ahead and eat!"

Interesting lesson this father taught his boys, and in a way that drove the point home. God our heavenly Father hates sin. He has us His grace and forgiven our sin. How can we stand even a little sin in our lives? Yet sin often fills our lives, and even a little bit has consequences in our lives. Even though we sin daily, daily God pours out his grace on us. He loves us with an everlasting lo We have died to sin and have new life in Christ. Let us live that new life every day.


