

#### **From Pastor**

Is it just me, or does it seem a little dry around Lake County? I was reminded of a late summer dry spell one year while I was in Eastern North Carolina. People began praying for a little bit of rain to keep things going, and the next thing you knew, we had 10"+ of rain in about 36 hours. And there wasn't a hurricane in sight! While it certainly didn't rain for 40 days & nights like it did in Genesis, I know there were people wondering if the rain would ever stop.

When God came to Noah and called him to build the ark, there weren't many signs of rain. While Noah faithfully built the ark, I wonder what people around him thought. Noah is often parodied by comedians, memorably for me by Bill Cosby. He is portrayed as one laughed at by his neighbors. But faithfulness is one reason God chose Noah to build the ark and save his family. Despite what people may or may not have been saying or thinking, Noah completed his God-given task. If he had not been faithful ... do you really want to think about that?

As Noah got all the animals on board, it began to rain. Even after the rain stopped, the water lingered on earth for 5 more months. After all was said & done, after all the water finally dried up, God set something in the sky: a rainbow, simple & beautiful. But to that simple beauty God attached a beautiful promise: Never again would he destroy the world by water





### Outreach Restaurant Ministry


